





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Knowledge Sequence	Lesson 1 Who am I? In this lesson children will begin to think about who they are. Children will look at baby photos and discuss how they have changed over time. They will be introduced to historical language (then, past, years ago) and begin to develop their understanding of a timeline. They will begin to consider what they think will happen to them in the future (grow taller etc).	Chronological Understanding Begin to understand the passage of time, for example, know 3 things they couldn't do as a baby but that they can do now.

	Historical Enquiry Use photographs to talk about the past.
Lesson 2 Where do I belong? In this lesson children will think about where they belong focusing on families. They will learn about different members within a family and their different roles. They will talk about who lives at home with them and understand the differences between people's families. Children will talk about their parents and grandparents and begin to talk about how old they are in relation to the children. Lesson 3 What are homes like? Are the all the same? In this lesson children will think about their home and different homes around the world. They will use photographs, books, and videos to consider the similarities and differences. This will lead on to future learning about how Tudors (Year 1) and Victorians (Year 2) lived. Lesson 4 Who are the Royal Family? In this lesson children will revisit their understanding of what families are and what their family is like. They will use this understanding to learn about who the Royal Family are and why they are important. This learning will support them throughout Year 1 and Year 2 where they future develop their knowledge of the Monarchy and its significance.
